

You want to submit an article to the journal

Handicap - Revue de Sciences Humaines et Sociales is a peer reviewed journal, providing researchers, academics, master's level, doctoral, post-doctoral students, the opportunity to publish their work in an area which is expanding rapidly.

The four issues published each year are either thematic, focusing on a single theme, or open to articles on different themes. Articles submitted to the editorial committee can be of different kinds: synthesis of a research outcomes, presentation of ongoing research, methodological or theoretical issues, literature review on a specific question, historical or legal issues, books reviews, in the field of disability.

The editorial committee will study each unsolicited proposal it receives.

Guidelines for submitting articles:

- 1) Submit articles in electronic format to revue@ctnerhi.com.fr, or send a diskette to : *Handicap – Revue de Sciences Humaines et Sociales*, CTNERHI, 236 bis rue de Tolbiac – 75013 Paris.
- 2) Texts must not exceed 6 000 words;
- 3) Use straight margins and double-space the whole text;
- 4) Provide the name(s) of author(s) at the top of the first page; in a footnote on the first page, indicate the position, activities and institutional coordinates of the author(s), as well as the full address where the main author be contacted, including if possible the e-mail address.
- 5) Two abstracts, one in French and the other in English, each of about 10 lines (about 100 words) should precede the text. This summary should indicate the subject of the article, the principal discipline within which the issue is examined, the methodology adopted, the principal results if the article presents a research study or an analysis of applied projects, and a discussion of the results.
- 6) Bibliographic references: articles or other works referred to in the text should be indicated as follows: (author's name, year of publication). For a quotation, the page number will follow the year of publication (ex. Olivier, 1983, p. 7 or pp. 151-152). If several articles or books published the same year by a same author are referred to, the letter a, b, c ... will be added after the year of publication. The full references will be listed at the end of the article. The list should not exceed 20 items, in alphabetical order, without being numbered, and presented according to the following norms:

Titles of journals must be written in full.

Following discussion by the editorial committee, submitted article are assessed by two "blind" referees. Their anonymous comments and eventual suggestions for modifications are subsequently sent to the author.

Manuscripts cannot be returned to authors. If an article is refused, the reasons for this decision and the referees' comments will be forwarded to the author.

Once published, the author receives 15 reprints of the article and a copy of the journal within three weeks after publication.
